### From and To: How Youth in Asia-Pacific Face #VAW Issue

For many years, Pacific Island countries have been titled as the region with the highest prevalence of violence against women (VAW). The practice of gender discrimination become an issue with alarming rate, especially within the family environment. Children and teenagers have a tremendous possibility of becoming witnesses or even future victims. To prevent this, many non-governmental organizations (NGOs) in Pacific Island countries now broaden their target groups to reach out youth. This is what happened at Solomon Islands and Tonga, where the NGOs tried to reach out youth to understand VAW and spread awareness of how important it is to put our action in preventing VAW. Supported by funding from UN Women, they use social media and volunteerism in education to educate youth regarding the implications of VAW. These same effort are also reflected in Southeast Asia. Benefitting from international organization (IGO) funding as well, NGOs in Viet Nam and Cambodia use social media and education to approach millennials. The link between youth with social media and education plays a vital role in this movement; the young generation is the future of gender equality, and social media is the most rampant information tool these days. This paper will analyze the correlation of creative collaborations between NGOs and IGOs in utilizing social media and grassroots education to engage with youth to eliminate VAW in Asia-Pacific and renew the idea to neighboring regions.
