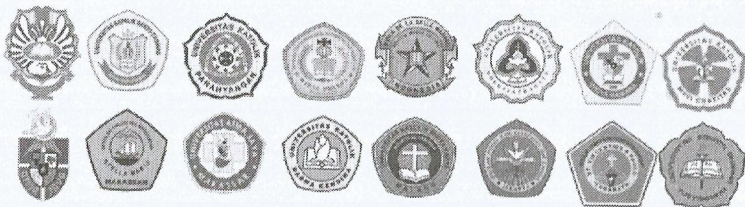

ABSTRACT

The purpose of the present research was to examine the effects of loan-to-deposit ratio (LDR), operating efficiency ratio (OER), and non-performing loan (NPL) on rural banks' profitability in Sidoarjo Regency. The present study was quantitative research, with samples of 54 BPR (bank perkreditan rakyat or rural bank) in the period of 2016. Multiple Regression Analysis is applied to verify this research framework. Results showed that 1) OER had a significant negative effect on ROA; 2) LDR had a significant negative effect on ROA; and 3) NPL had no significant negative effect on ROA. The coefficient of LDR is negative, indicating that any increase in LDR will decrease the ROA value. LDR has a negative effect on ROA due to cost inefficiency or a high NPL. The third hypothesis is rejected since the loan risks generated by BPR are quite stable, not to disrupt the value of the company's profitability. Also, BPR obtains additional significant revenues from penalties on late repayments. The present study may contribute to other researchers and also banking policy makers with regard to developing strategies useful for both communities enjoying credit facilities and the stakeholders of BPRs.

This paper elaborates the connection between peasant life and Christian faith amidst ecological tragedies. New vocabularies, such as "crucified peasants" and "Biyung Bumi", express the dynamics of encounters. The narration of an Indonesian ecological liberation theology owes academically to the narratives of three Asian-born theologians, Kosuke Koyama, Masao Takenaka and Hwa-Young Chong. Listening to the narratives of Indonesian peasants' life both through the short stories and novels of Ahmad Tohari, this theological narration seeks to carry ecological creatures down from the cross.

Abstract

Mekar Sari Village, Selaawi District, Garut Regency is a village known as the largest bird nest producer in West Java. It is in this village that bird nest supplies for big cities like Bandung and Jakarta come from. With the industry growing rapidly, it turns out that to date, it has not had a major impact on the development of the village itself. Based on this, the Parahyangan Catholic University Community Service Program (P3M) conducted a survey and data search on the root of the problems that occurred in this village. From the data processing, the main problem conditions found in sub-village 3 of Mekar Sari Village were education, health and economic issues. In the program this time, students of P3M participants were deployed to analyze problems, propose personal projects and hamlet projects and carry out to be able to contribute to solving the existing problems.
